

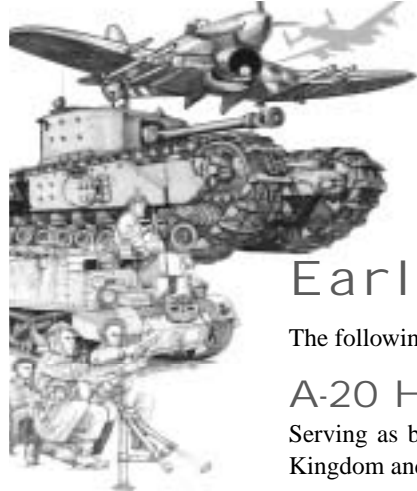
BRITISH AIR ASSETS

The following units are available as Air Assets to all British forces. They are divided into Early, Mid and Late War periods, and a British force may only use aircraft from its own period.

British Air Assets

Early War

The following are all the Air Assets available to an Early War British force.

A-20 Havoc – 230 points

Serving as both a light bomber and night fighter, the Havoc was an aircraft used by the United States, the United Kingdom and the Soviet Union.

A-20	5	Cruise Burn	4xD10	6+	5+/5+	8+	Hits/4, Multifire/all



Unit: A-20 with four Browning .303 MGs (FaF) and three Browning .303 MGs.

Options: The A-20 Havoc may be given four 500lb. bombs for +150 points or two 1,000lb. bombs for +125 points. All ordnance may be dropped in a single Shoot (Bomb) action.

Blackburn Roc – 175 points

An ambitious design originally intended to be an amphibious landing fighter, this concept was abandoned and the Roc was ushered out of service as an obsolete design just four years after its introduction in 1939.

Unit: Roc with four Browning .303 MGs (FaF).

Options: The Roc may be given eight 30lb. bombs for +50 points. All ordnance may be dropped in a single Shoot (Bomb) action.



British Air Assets

De Havilland Mosquito – 195 points

The “Mossie” served throughout World War II as an exceptional bomber and multi-role aircraft. Its longevity was made all the more exceptional by the fact it was mostly constructed from wood, not metal.

Unit: Mosquito with four 20mm Hispano cannons (FaF) and four Browning .303 MGs (FaF).

B Mk. XVI Variant: The Mosquito can replace its Hispano Cannons and Browning .303 MGs entirely for one 4000lb. bomb for +0 points or six 500lb. bombs for +0 points. All ordnance may be dropped in a single Shoot (Bomb) action.

Fairey Firefly – 180 points

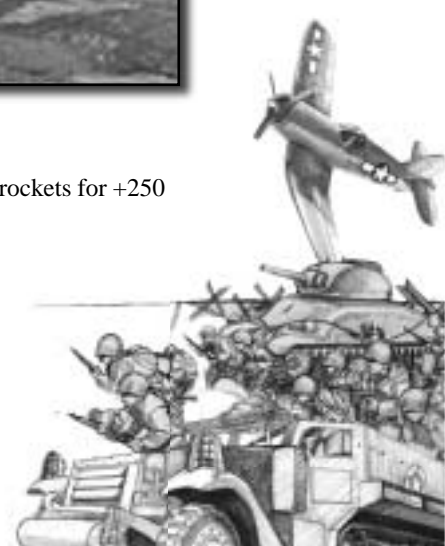
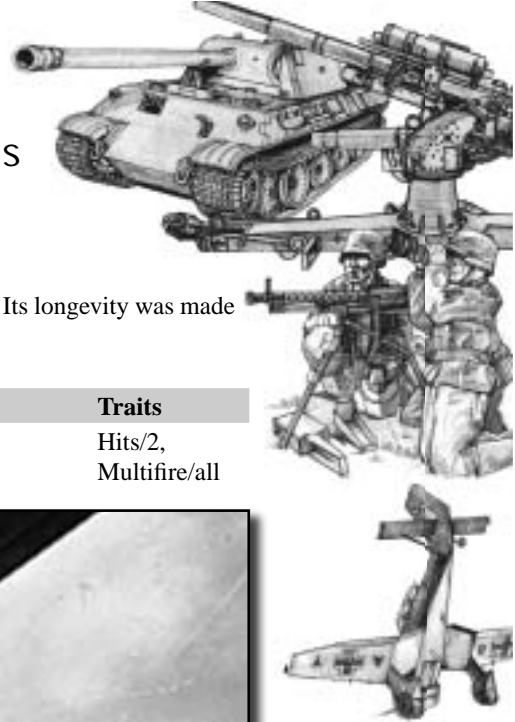
Only entering active service towards the end of the war in Europe, the Firefly was superior to earlier Fairey designs in almost every respect.

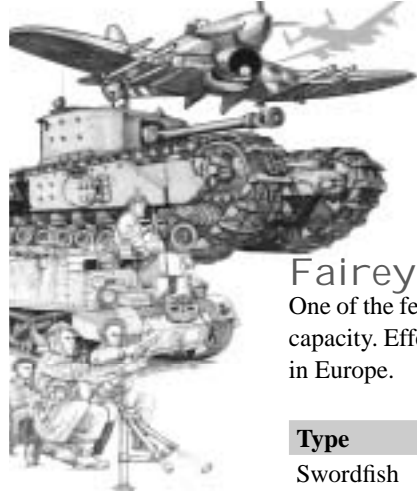
Type	Size	Move	Close Combat	Target	Save	Kill	Traits
Firefly	4	Cruise Burn	4xD10	6+	6+/5+	8+	Hits/2, Multifire/all



Unit: Firefly with four 20mm Hispano cannons (FaF).

Options: The Firefly may be given may be given two 1000lb. bombs for +130 points and sixteen RP-3 rockets for +250 points. All ordnance may be dropped in a single Shoot (Bomb) action.





British Air Assets

Fairey Swordfish – 165 points

One of the few biplane designs to see serious use in World War II, the Fairey Swordfish was utilised in a torpedo bomber capacity. Effective despite its outdated design, the Swordfish remained in frontline service through to the end of the war in Europe.

Unit: Swordfish with one Browning .303 MGs (FaF) and one Browning .303 MG (FaA).

Options: The Swordfish may be given eight RP-3 rockets for +200 points and one 1,670lb. torpedo for +75 points. All ordnance may be dropped in a single Shoot (Bomb) action.

Torpedo: Torpedo ordnance can only be dropped into water terrain. If they are dropped into other kinds of terrain, they have no effect and are removed from play.

Grumman F6F Hellcat – 200 points

Though replaced after the war by British aircraft, the Hellcat was a solid addition to the Fleet Air Arm.

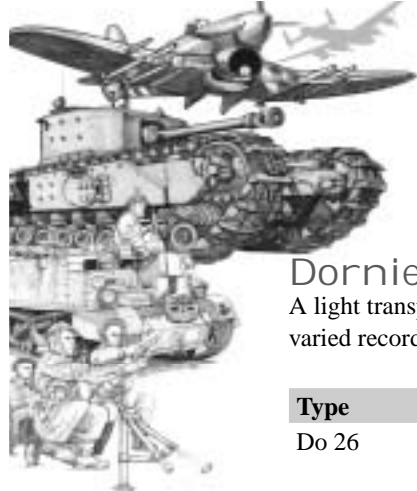

Unit: F6F with six Browning .50 MGs (FaF).

Options: The F6F may be given one 1,000lb. bomb for +65 points.





German Air Assets

Dornier Do 26 – 150 points

A light transport flying-boat pressed into military service by the Luftwaffe, the Do 26 was a limited run aircraft with a varied record of service.

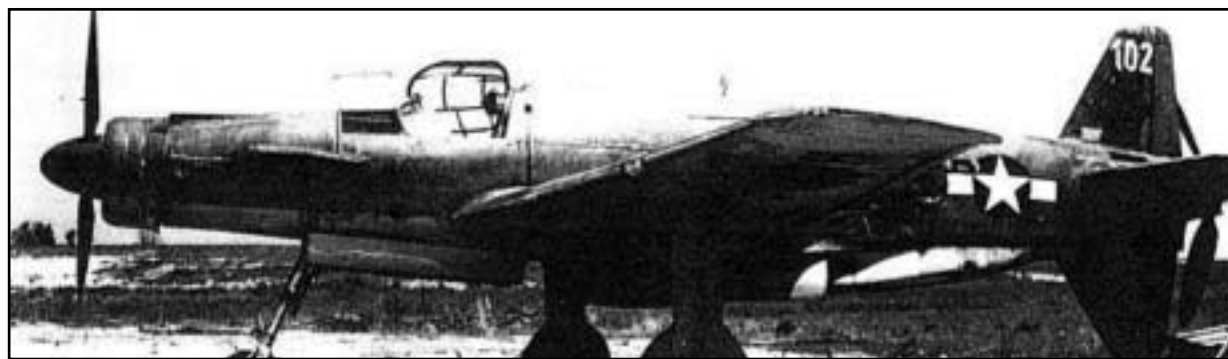


Unit: Do 26 with one MG 151/20E (FaF) and three MGs (FaA).

Dornier Do 335 – 180 points

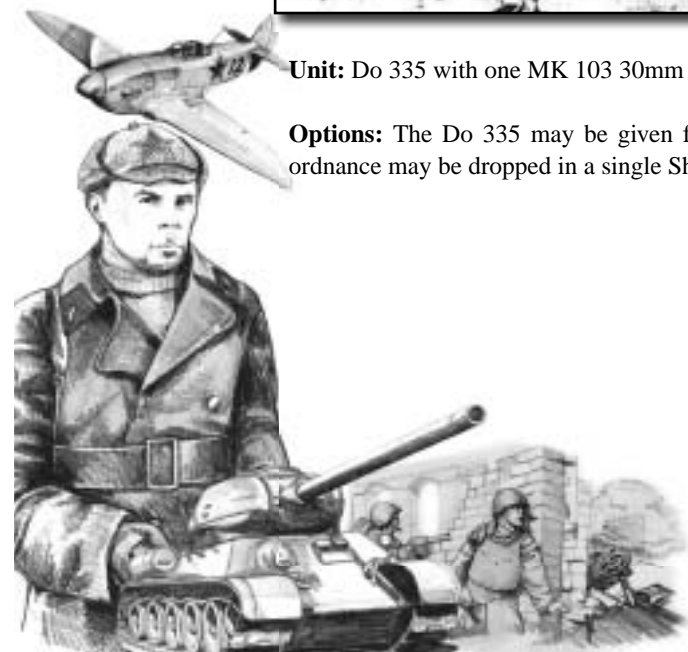
While the Luftwaffe had high hopes for this design, nicknamed the 'Arrow', delays in production kept the Do 335 out of the war until 1944.

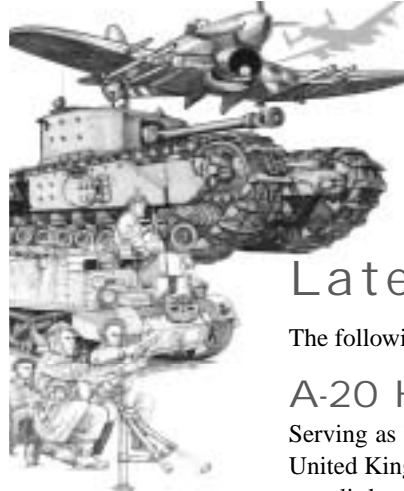
Type	Size	Move	Close Combat	Target	Save	Kill	Traits
Do 335	4	Cruise Burn	4xD10	6+	5+/4+	8+	Hits/3, Multifire/all



Unit: Do 335 with one MK 103 30mm cannon (FaF) and two MG 151/20E cannons (FaF).

Options: The Do 335 may be given four 250lb. bombs for +100 points, or two 500lb. bombs for +75 points. All ordnance may be dropped in a single Shoot (Bomb) action.





US Air Assets

Late War

The following are all the Air Assets available to a Late War US force.

A-20 Havoc – 220 points

Serving as both a light bomber and night fighter, the Havoc was a cross-Allies aircraft used by the United States, the United Kingdom and the Soviet Union. In the later months of the war, the A-20 was an almost obsolete design and saw very little combat use.

A-20	5	Cruise Burn	4xD10	6+	5+/5+	8+	Hits/4, Multifire/all



Unit: A-20 with four Browning .303 MGs (FaF) and three Browning .303 MGs.

Options: The A-20 Havoc may be given four 500lb. bombs for +150 points or two 1,000lb. bombs for +125 points. All ordnance may be dropped in a single Shoot (Bomb) action.

F4U Corsair– 230 points

Later in the war, the Corsair had cemented its reputation as a superb ground attack craft that could take care of itself if enemy fighters were over the target.

F4U	4	Cruise Burn	5xD10	6+	5+/4+	9+	Hits/3, Multifire/all



Unit: F4U with six Browning .50 MGs (FaF).

Options: The F4U may be given two 1,000lb. bombs for +125 points, or four 1,000lb. bombs for +250 points. All ordnance may be dropped in a single Shoot (Bomb) action. The six Browning .50 MGs may be replaced with four 20mm Hispano cannons (FaF) for +25 points. Eight HVARs may be added for +165 points.

Other Aircraft: With the options above, you can represent most of the many variants of Corsair, though all of the options were available to the F4U-4.
